The good news is that your pictures have metadata that can be used to keep your files and folders straight. This metadata is like a digital address book that tells your photos where they came from, who took them, the date they were taken, and the approximate time they were taken. (Your camera's viewfinder can also tell your pictures these things, and your memory card can also have metadata, but I haven't seen that much metadata on memory cards.) ## Creating Metadata Metadata is an extension to photo files. It's a digital file name that records more detailed information about a photo than a simple filename. \_Metadata\_ is the fancy term for the data that's associated with a file. Metadata comes in three different forms: \* \*\*Exif metadata:\*\* Part of a picture file, this metadata tells you the name of the camera, lens, and the time and location the picture was taken. Q: Passing data to a Content Script in Chrome I'm having trouble with content scripts in Chrome. All other browsers are fine with it. I can inject scripts into the page, however, I am having trouble sending messages to the page from my script. I'm using a chrome extension to open a form on the page. The form saves its information to a MySQL database, and then I'd like to be able to send the data to my content script. Here's what I'm doing: `chrome.tabs.create({url:'mypage.php'}, function(tab) { chrome.tabs.executeScript(tab.id, {file: 'js/myfunc.js'}); });` I tried injecting the script, but that didn't work. If anyone could suggest how I can do this, it would be much appreciated. A: Ok. So I figured out that you can't send data from a content script to an existing tab. Therefore, I had to switch to a background script, which runs at startup.
